ITS Windows Update



ITS is pushing an update to Windows computers next week. This is happening because the University's Active Directory, the database which manages user accounts and groups, is being reorganized.

If you forget and turn your computer off, then the update and reboots will occur when you turn your computer back on. Note for off-campus users only: This change will be applied to your university computer when you connect to the campus network or login to the VPN. Research Study on Gender Inequality in Higher Education

- have never served as an academic dean or higher at a Research Doctoral institution; and
- experienced within the past 10 years what you believe to be the glass ceiling while pursuing a promotion to academic dean at a Research Doctoral institution and were unsuccessful in obtaining the position.

Confidential interviews with those selected to participate will occur during June and July 2017. There is no compensation for participating. Participation is voluntary. I-9 Workshop Sessions

The Office of International Programs has scheduled numerous <u>I-9 Workshop Sessions</u> to accommodate new international hires for the Fall 2017 semester. New hires who visit the International Student and Scholar Office (ISSO) for assistance with their I-9 will be re-directed to one of these sessions. Any student or faculty member who is on a foreign passport and does not already have a Green Card or valid EAD card with photo must begin the I-9 process with ISSO. If a foreign national has a Green Card (Permanent Resident Card) or an EAD Card (Employment Authorization Card) which has his/her photo, I-9 processing can be handled directly by Human Resources.
