The Faculty Scholarship of Teaching and Learning Grants Committee is requesting proposals for this year's round of funding for Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SOTL) Grants. The grants are available to individual faculty members, departments, colleges, programs, academies, or standing committees to support them in projects that will examine and reflect upon the teaching and learning practices in their discipline. These projects may be aimed at curricular reforms, research that informs teaching and learning at the local level, or improving the quality of instruction in the undergraduate and graduate programs of the unit or the campus. Because <u>Curriculog</u> allows us to have a much more accurate picture of the time it takes for course and curriculum proposals to be reviewed, we are now able to establish a set of deadlines to guide this practice going forward. Beginning in the 2017-2018 academic year, we will adhere to the below set of deadlines for course and curriculum proposals.

Course and Curriculum Deadlines for 2018-2019 Undergraduate and Graduate Catalogs

- January 31, 2018: Deadline for proposals to be launched AND approved by the Originator via <u>Curriculog</u>
- April 1, 2018: Deadline for all course and curriculum proposals to be reviewed/approved by the Undergraduate Course & Curriculum Committee (UCCC) and/or Graduate Council
- June 1, 2018: 2018-2019 Undergraduate Catalog released online
- June 15, 2018: 2018-2019 Graduate Catalog released online
