Faculty Fellow, Honors College

The Honors College invites applications for a Faculty Fellow to oversee the proposal and course development process with faculty wishing to teach an honors course (LBST H sections or HONR 3700 seminars) in the Honors College. The expected term will be two years, beginning July 1, 2018, and is renewable. The position provides a stipend but no course release. Candidates should:

- Know the expectations and pedagogy of honors courses in their department, college, and/or the Honors College, and be willing to develop additional knowledge of expectations and pedagogy across honors
- Have participated in honors as a teacher/mentor/thesis advisor on campus or elsewhere
- Be able to think and communicate interdisciplinarily with faculty from any discipline
- Demonstrate successful teaching that is creative, rigorous, and allows student-driven inquiry
- Be available to participate in the activities of the professional staff of the Honors College, including bi-weekly staff meetings, an annual retreat, and key events with students and faculty, and to do planning work during the summer, beginning July 1, 2018

Interested UNC Charlotte full-time faculty at any rank and from any discipline are invited to submit a letter of interest that outlines their qualifications and a c.v. with honors and teaching related activity highlighted to Dr. Malin Pereira, Professor of English and Executive Director, Honors College, by June 15, 2018.
