### Day of Convocation scheduled for August 20, 2018; classes to begin at 5:00 p.m.

Welcome to a new year! To celebrate and welcome our new students, provide clear academic expectations and an understanding about what it means to be a 49er, we will hold our annual Day of Convocation on the first day of the Fall 2018 term, Monday, August 20, 2018. Following the Day 1 events, classes will begin campus-wide for all students at 5:00 p.m. on August 20. Just as a Commencement ceremony marks the completion of a course of study, Convocation celebrates a student's entry into the community of higher education. The New Student Convocation is part of the Student Success Working Group's new student induction initiatives and will include remarks from alumni and current students who will present the traditions of the institution and introduce the Noble Niner Honor Code, a faculty keynote address, and the inaugural performance of our Pride of Niner Nation Marching Band. This event will acquaint students with UNC Charlotte's academic expectations, communicate the institutional mission and values, and build camaraderie for our increasingly diverse student body. Transfer Interest from Saudi Arabian Students Studying in Canada

As you may be aware, the Saudi Arabian Government announced on August 7, 2018, that all of their students studying in Canada should leave the country. The Saudi Arabian Cultural Mission (SACM), the primary funding agency for most of the impacted students in Canada, is working to support students in identifying new universities around the world for their students to transfer. UNC Charlotte is working to prepare a statement to share with SACM related to the graduate, undergraduate, and English language training opportunities at our institution. In most cases, any student looking at transferring at the UG or Graduate level would likely not be admissible until the Spring 2019 semester. Graduate Admissions, Undergraduate Admissions, and the English Language Training Institute are creating a landing page on their respective websites to share information/guidance.
