One of the most widely recognized scientists in the world today, Dr. Michio Kaku is a theoretical physicist, bestselling author, acclaimed public speaker, renowned futurist, and popularizer of science. He is an authority in Einstein's unified field theory predicting trends affecting business, medicine, finance, and our way of life, based on the latest research in science. As co-founder of String Field Theory, Dr. Kaku carries on Einstein's quest to unite the four fundamental forces of nature into a single grand unified theory of everything. He has written four NY Times Best Sellers. His latest, The Future of Humanity, discusses the future of the space program, when one day we might explore the stars. The Office of Undergraduate Research (OUR) is seeking a full-time faculty member to serve as the Faculty Fellow for the Charlotte Research Scholars Program. The stipend for this position is \$8000. The Charlotte Research Scholars (CRS) program is administered out of the Office of Undergraduate Research. It provides UNC Charlotte undergraduate students funding to participate in a ten-week summer research program (May 29, 2019 to July 26, 2019). Scholars receive one-on-one, faculty-guided research training, and participate in weekly professional development sessions to better prepare them for graduate school and a future research career. The program culminates in the Summer Research Symposium. The OUR is seeking candidates with experience mentoring undergraduate students and knowledge about research training programs for undergraduate students.
