Submit Your Course and Curriculum Proposals

This is a reminder to submit your course and curriculum proposals now. The earlier you submit, the more likely the proposal will reach final approval in time for publication in the next Catalog. We suggest submitting your proposals by December 21. Last year, proposals submitted by December were much more likely to be approved timely than proposals submitted closer to the January 31 deadline. Course and Curriculum Deadlines for 2019-2020 Catalog:

- December 21: Suggested deadline for proposals launch and approval by Originator via Curriculog
- January 31: Deadline for proposals to be launched and approved by Originator via Curriculog
- March 4: Fall 2019 Schedule of Classes posted online
- April 1: Deadline for proposals to be reviewed/approved by the UCCC and/or Graduate Council step
- June 1: 2019-2020 Undergraduate Catalog released online
- June 15: 2019-2020 Graduate Catalog released online

REMINDER: Spring Bill Due Date / Optional 5-Installment Payment Plan

As a reminder, please review these upcoming changes for students' spring bills and help spread the word. More info can be found on the Niner Central website.

- The new spring bill due date for students is December 5. (In past years, the bills for spring were due in the first week of January.)
- **New 5-installment payment plan**: We are now offering an optional payment plan that divides their amount due into five smaller payments (prior to this we only offered a 3-installment plan).
- A \$55 setup fee is required when they opt-in to the payment plan.
- No down payment: This new 5-payment plan does NOT require a 10% down payment like the old plan.
- Action date: December 5: By December 5, students need to either pay their balance in full, or sign up for the payment plan. At 11:59pm on December 5, their <u>classes will be cancelled</u> if they haven't paid their balance in full or signed up for a payment plan.

Matthew Gropp, MS, Earth Sciences, and Julia Signorelli, MA, English, recently received the Graduate School's Outstanding Master's Thesis Award. The Master's Thesis Award goes annually to a student nominated by faculty for the quality of their thesis work. This year's award applies to students who completed their master's degree requirements and thesis between Fall 2016 and Summer 2018. Recipients receive a plaque and cash prize. Julia Signorelli's thesis, Of Pumpkin Spice Lattes, Hamplanets, and Fatspeak: The Venting Genre as Support and Subversion on Reddit's r/FatPeopleStories, analyses content of this popular online venue to examine how these discussions can both support and challenge cultural norms. Transition on the Lifetime and Evolution of Supercell Thunderstorms in the Great Plains seeks to better predict how supercells, a weather system producing severe storms and possibly hail and tornadoes, will evolve by focusing on trends in environmental parameters.

The NC Diversity and Inclusion Partners (NC-DIP) 2018 Conference is scheduled for December 7, 2018, at UNC Charlotte. NC-DIP includes nine universities in North Carolina. The conference is a great way to meet individuals in the field, gather new information as well as hear new research on diversity and inclusion. The plenary speaker at the conference is Dr. Johnetta Cole, an expert in diversity training. Several representatives from the National Coalition Building Institute (NCBI) will also present on their diversity training programs and opportunities for collaborations between diverse groups. Additional workshops on measuring cultural climate, creating a sense of belonging, and navigating cultural biases are also available.
