Course and Curriculum Deadlines for 2020-2021 Catalogs

This is a reminder to start submitting course and curriculum proposals. The earlier you start, the more likely the proposal will reach final approval in time for publication in the next Catalog. For more information, visit <u>Course and Curriculum Deadlines and FAQs.</u>

- October 31: Strongly recommended deadline for 'Course Revision' proposals to be launched and approved by Originator via Curriculog
- December 31: Deadline for all course and curriculum proposals to be launched and approved by Originator via Curriculog
- March 2: Fall 2020 Schedule of Classes posted online
- March 23: Deadline for 'Course Revision' proposals to reach Banner step and receive Fall 2020 effective term
- March 30: Fall 2020 Registration begins

- April 1: Deadline for all course and curriculum proposals to be reviewed/approved by the UCCC and/or Graduate Council steps
- June 1: 2020-2021 Undergraduate Catalog released online
- June 15: 2020-2021 Graduate Catalog released online

A Note Regarding Other Timing Considerations: As you plan for curriculum changes, please be aware of other agencies outside of UNC Charlotte that will likely add time before the curriculum change can be implemented. New site locations, site closures, and new degree, certificate, joint degree, and dual degree programs may require approval from the UNC System Office, SACS, and/or the U.S. Department of Education. These notifications/approvals can take several additional months and vary by the type of curricular modification. Originators will be contacted during the curriculum review process via Curriculog if additional notifications/approvals are necessary.

Urban Institute Faculty Fellows Program Seeks Ways to Better Our Region

A new program designed to identify solutions for some of the pressing needs and issues facing the greater Charlotte region is getting underway this fall at the UNC Charlotte Urban Institute. For the first time, the Institute has named a cohort of Faculty Fellows to conduct research projects and work alongside local stakeholders to understand and share findings that can guide community decision-making. The program includes competitive research funding ranging from \$7,500-\$15,000 per project and quarterly meetings to engage with the community.

OIP Hosts Fulbright Pre-Departure East Asia and the Pacific Orientation

During the week of July 14, the Office of International Programs had the pleasure of hosting nearly 175 Fulbright grantees on campus for the Fulbright Pre-Departure Orientation: East Asia and the Pacific. The group consisted of Fulbright scholars, student researchers, and English teaching assistants, all of whom were preparing to depart for one of twelve countries across the region. Additionally, grantees were joined by embassy staff from across East Asia and the Pacific as well as representatives from the Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs, a division of the U.S. Department of State. The grantees participated in a range of sessions and workshops including topics such as identity abroad, health and safety, research methods, and social media strategies. UNC Charlotte faculty and staff with expertise in the region led many of these sessions. The week of programming was coordinated and implemented by the Office of Intercultural and Educational Experiences, the English Language Training Institute, and the Office of Global Education and Engagement.
