2019 Progress Report for Diversity Plan



A <u>Progress Report</u> for the UNC Charlotte Plan for Campus Diversity, Access, and Inclusion has recently been completed. 2020-2021 Faculty Research Grants Program

The Faculty Research Grants Committee (FRGC) is soliciting proposals for the 2020-2021 Faculty Research Grants Program. Each individual project may have a maximum budget of \$8,000, including a stipend of up to \$4,200. Faculty submitting joint

proposals may request up to \$16,000 (\$8,000 per faculty member).

Visualizing Twitter Workshop

Atkins Library will host a workshop to introduce UNC Charlotte faculty and graduate students to a curriculum project that engages students in an exploration of Twitter and public discourse. This workshop will walk participants through the steps of conceiving, planning, executing, and assessing a two-week unit that invites students to explore the relationship among social media, visualization of large datasets, and humanities questions. We will examine and evaluate a completed sample unit, discuss the pedagogical benefits and drawbacks of the visualization software Tableau, and develop familiarity with some of the classroom applications of Twitter.
