# **Spring 2020 and Session B Final Grades**

Final grades for spring 2020 and session B can be submitted through My UNC Charlotte beginning April 24. Grading will be available until May 11 at Noon. For each student, select the appropriate grade from the drop-down menu. The appropriate grades are:

#### Standard

Undergraduate - A, B, C, D, F\* or I\*\*

Graduate - A, B, C, U\* or I\*\*

\*When submitting an F or U grade, the last participation date is required.

\*\*When submitting a grade of I, please make sure to confirm the Incomplete Extension Date by clicking submit on the confirmation page.

#### Pass/No Credit

Undergraduate – P (Pass) or N (No Credit) or H (Honors)

Graduate – P (Pass) or U (Unsatisfactory)

#### Audit

AU (Audit) or NR (No Record)

#### Important Reminders:

- Please assign grades as originally planned. Students will not have the ability to elect a P/N (undergraduates) or P/U (graduates) option until after the original grade has been entered.
- Students who have officially withdrawn from a course and received a grade of W or WE do not need a grade assigned.
- If a student has never attended the course (and they do not have a grade of W or WE), then enter a grade of F, U, or N from the grade drop-down menu. Additionally, please provide the date for your first day of class in Last Attend Date, along with a zero (0) in the Attend Hours.
- If the student attended but stopped participating during the term, enter a grade of F, U, or N and enter the last participatory date for the student in Last Attend Date.
- If the student attended the entire term and earned an F, U, or N grade, please enter a grade of F, U, or N and the last day of class (not exam) in Last Attend Date.
- A grade of I is assigned at your discretion when a student, who is otherwise passing, has not completed all the work in a course due to circumstances beyond their control.
- A grade of IP is only assigned for prearranged courses extending over more than one semester and is NOT to be used as a substitute for an Incomplete.
- Final grades can also be submitted to Banner using Canvas. Canvas can be accessed through My UNC Charlotte.

• Grades not submitted by the deadline will be assigned an NG grade and will require a grade change. Students will be unable to make an election for P/N or P/U until the grade is changed.

#### **Summer Courses**

To support the move to a fully online summer 2020, the Banner campus code on all summer courses (first half, second half and the full-term) has been updated to "Distance Education." This campus code allows tuition and fees to be assessed appropriately at the Distance Education rates.

Changes to the Banner instructional method will be completed by April 24. The instructional method options are either internet asynchronous (no regular meetings) or internet synchronous (regular required meetings).

Summer classes start on May 18 and the summer second half term begins June 29. More information on bill payment and financial aid is available on the <u>Niner Central website</u>. Faculty and staff may consult the <u>Summer School website</u> for summer pay dates and to request any course changes.

Our 30 credit-hour master's program includes full-time and part-time students, and prepares graduates to work in a variety of higher education administration and student affairs positions in colleges and universities. UNC Charlotte is equipped to support WebEx and Google Meets for synchronous online meetings, but hosts of any e-meeting solution should check common security settings and adjust them appropriately to help safeguard sessions. # Ventureprise Launch NSF I-Corps Summer 2020 Virtual Cohort

Have an idea or research finding that the National Science Foundation may be interested in funding? Have an idea in response to COVID-19 and the current situation? Want to receive up to \$5000 for your research or business idea? Apply to participate in the Summer 2020 Ventureprise Launch National Science Foundation I-Corps virtual cohort. The program provides UNC Charlotte faculty, staff and students with commercialization training and up to an initial \$5000 in NSF funding. The goal of the program is to identify potential commercial uses and prepare for more substantial commercialization funding opportunities. The next stage is a six month \$50,000 NSF I-Corps Teams grant. The cohort will begin May 13 (rolling applications, last day to submit is May 8). #### Film Screen with a Dean: Paywall: The Business of Scholarship

As part of the series, "Film Screen with a Dean," Anne Cooper Moore, dean of the J. Murrey Atkins Library, invites you to a virtual panel discussion about academic and open access publishing in response to the documentary *Paywall: The Business of Scholarship*.

• Tuesday, April 28, 3:00 - 4:00 PM (*Register*)

The film focuses on the need for open access to research and science, and questions the rationale behind the \$25.2 billion a year that flows into for-profit academic publishers, examines the 35-40% profit margin associated with the top academic publisher, Elsevier, and looks at how that profit margin is often greater than some of the most profitable tech companies.

Everyone is encouraged to view <u>Paywall</u> for free before the virtual discussion. A panel of experts will present issues and themes of this movie and answer your questions about the academic and open access publishing landscape. Panelists include:
