Phi Kappa Phi Receives Literacy Grant Funding for "Love of Reading" Project



For the first time in the chapter's history, the UNC Charlotte Chapter of Phi Kappa Phi was awarded a \$2,000 literacy grant to fund the 2020-2021 "Love of Reading" Project, a joint literacy project with Kappa Delta Pi, Omicron Pi Chapter, at UNC Charlotte.



The Love of Reading project supports Reedy Creek Elementary through a series of events planned by both PKP and KDP, such as in school reading through student and staff volunteers and expanding classroom libraries through donations and book purchases.



Workshops on reading pedagogy for early childhood development will be led by the Kappa Delta Pi honor society. Additionally, Phi Kappa Phi plans to host a book drive and purchase 4-5 books for each of the classrooms based on recommendations by the teachers and literacy leads from the school.

Graduate Student Virtual Orientation Set for September 3

The Center for Graduate Life will host a virtual orientation session for new graduate students from 10:00-11:00 a.m. on Thursday, September 3. Through the orientation session, new students can get tips from current graduate students in a live Q&A session, plus have an opportunity to hear from Graduate School Dean Tom Reynolds and Associate Dean Katherine Hall-Hertel. Faculty Selected for UNC System Online Course Assessment for Critical, High-Demand Courses

Several faculty members are selected for a critical project that will support faculty and universities across the UNC System to refine and improve our online offerings, especially in critical, high-demand courses, during the ongoing COVID19 outbreak.

Selected faculty include: Melanie Harris for Biology 1, Jordan Poler for Chemistry 1, Shankari Somayaji for Anatomy and Physiology, and Beth Bumgardner for Statistics. In addition, Garvey Pyke, Enoch Park and Bruce Richards (all from the Center of Teaching and Learning) are selected as instructional designers for Statistics.

The overall project will target 8-10 courses that are critical to student progress that might be offered online due to continued social distancing requirements. Faculty teams will be asked to scour existing digital resources—from within the UNC System, other universities or providers, and those available for licensing or as Open Educational Resources—to identify best-in-class materials and curate those materials into a resource library. The faculty teams also will determine if an adaptive courseware product should be centrally procured and applied for the course; develop an implementation guide and outreach/communication materials to facilitate adoption; and work with UNC System Office staff to develop an assessment plan.

New Graduate Academic Petition System is Live

The new Graduate Academic Petition System is live and can be reached by visiting <u>academicpetition.uncc.edu</u>. As of today, students are being directed to the new system to submit their petitions. Faculty will have access to both systems until all open petitions have been completed in the old system.
