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Academic Policy Changes

Classroom Attendance Policy

Faculty Council <u>approved changes to the Classroom Attendance policy</u> to allow excused absences for students who are participating in University-sanctioned events. The changes instruct faculty to allow students excused absences in instances in which the students are representing the university in university-sanctioned activities. Despite the fact that many classes continue to operate remotely, there may still be instances this semester in which students are participating in university-sanctioned activities such as academic or athletic teams.

Commencement and New Student Convocation Faculty Attendance Policy

Registration Open for W+GRA Summit

Registration is now open for the W+GRA 2021 Summit: Recovery and Discovery: Women and Girls in a Dual Pandemic. The virtual Summit will take place on March 10 from 8:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. The Summit will include a Women in Leadership keynote panel, featuring Chancellor Sharon Gaber, Provost Joan Lorden, and Mecklenburg County Manager Dena Diorio. Morning and afternoon panel sessions will focus on research and community practice experiences, as well as the impact of COVID-19 on women and girls. Registration is free but required.
