#### **Venture prise Launch NSF I-Corps Summer 2021 Virtual Cohort Now Accepting Applications**

Join 350+ UNC Charlotte faculty and students that have already completed the Ventureprise Launch program. Apply to participate in the Summer 2021 Ventureprise Launch National Science Foundation I-Corps Virtual Cohort to receive up to \$5,000 for your research or business idea. The program provides UNC Charlotte faculty, staff and students with commercialization training and new NSF funding. Applications will close May 20. This virtual cohort with a tiered approach launches June 2. The goal of the program is to identify potential commercial uses for technology and research. The next

stage is a six month \$50,000 NSF I-Corps Teams grant. Applications are currently open and are reviewed as they are submitted.
