To help in this area, the Graduate School has led the development of <u>University Policy: 318, Authorship Policy and Resolution Procedures</u>. ## Legal Affairs Training: Copyright Infringement

The Bling May Sting: Considerations for the Lawful Use of Copyrighted Materials in Your University Work
