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Flu Vaccine Attestation Deadline November 15

The University is requiring a <u>flu vaccine attestation</u> from all employees and students. The attestation deadline is November 15. Failure to complete the form by the deadline will result in the suspension of NinerNET credentials. Everyone who completes the form will be entered into a drawing for a variety of prizes. Any questions can be directed to <u>emergency@uncc.edu</u>.

While the University is not requiring the flu vaccine for employees and students, the University does strongly encourage everyone to receive the vaccine if medically able to do so. Influenza (flu) is a serious respiratory disease that kills an average of 36,000 persons and hospitalizes more than 200,000 persons in the United States each year. Vaccination helps reduce the chances of contracting the virus and significantly lessens symptoms if you do. The influenza vaccine does not prevent COVID-19, but it does help lessen the demands on the healthcare system and the confusion between the two illnesses since they have similar symptoms. All UNC Charlotte students and employees are offered the flu vaccine at no out-of-pocket cost with most major insurance coverage.

Graduate Admissions Migrating to SLATE

Graduate Admissions is transitioning to Slate by Technolutions, a system that will provide the University with a more comprehensive, scalable, integrated and sustainable recruitment and admissions system. The current AdmissionPros system (mygradschool.uncc.edu and eGRAD.uncc.edu) will be brought down on November 16 at 11:59 p.m., and we anticipate going live with Slate on November 21. During that time, the applicant, recommender, and GPD portals will be unavailable. Between November 16-21:

- 1. data and supporting documents in AdmissionPros will be migrated to Slate;
- 2. prospective students for 2022 will be emailed new system credentials to access the system;
- 3. recommendation providers who have not submitted a reference will be provided information to do so in Slate;
- 4. Graduate Program Directors and admissions committee members will be emailed the link to access Slate.

All current eGRAD users will have access to Slate as soon as the system is live, and training documentation for decision makers and committee members will be provided online. Virtual and face-to-face Slate training will also be available beginning the week of November 22 for anyone who wishes to attend and details will be provided shortly. The Graduate School is excited to launch an admissions management system that is more tailored to the user and positions Charlotte to more effectively recruit the graduate class. NinerScholars Portal Open for Student Applications

The NinerScholars Portal is now open for students to apply for scholarships for the 2022-23 academic year. During the current application cycle, only students who have been admitted to the University will be allowed to access NinerScholars to apply for scholarships. All units are asked to review their webpages and print material to ensure scholarship-related information is current and all messaging directs students to access the NinerScholars Portal through the University Scholarship Office webpage. If your college or department has not completed the Scholarship Content Review Process for AY22/23, you'll need to do so before the University Scholarship Office can open your scholarship for student applications. Scholarship funds that currently have a balance insufficient to make an AY22/23 award, but receive necessary funding before January 1, 2022, may still be opened for applications in NinerScholars. Please contact the University Scholarship Office if this situation applies to you. The University Scholarship Office will provide a training resource to all NinerScholars users during the spring semester. Updated user guides and an explanation of new functionality in the Portal will be provided. All new and current scholarship administrators are encouraged to participate.
